тие <b>1</b>	<b>Prayer for IN Nepal</b> – Pray for the staff team at IN Nepal, as there have been frictions between the leadership, the board, and the staff team. Please pray that God's Holy Spirit will be present to bring peace and draw people to Him so they can see themselves as God sees them, precious loved and reconciled to Him and one another.
Wed 2	<b>Prayer for IN Nepal -</b> Please remember the Nepali people, as the Church grows and people embrace the Gospel. Hostility has been increasing, especially from some government circles, as change is perceived as a Western influence. Yet the Nepali people recognise and praise the service of Christians to their own communities. Pray for continued Spiritual awakening.
Thu <b>3</b>	<b>Prayer for IN Nepal -</b> As the team continue to reach out with programmes in Livelihoods, developing poor communities and reaching out to women who are marginalised. Pray for the resources to be made available for projects and the women's work called Lydia.
Fri <b>4</b>	<b>Pray for IN Nepal –</b> As the board seeks to support the organisation without a head, pray that the staff team can work together effectively, and that the search for a new Executive Director reveals good candidates called by the Lord to work with IN, with the necessary abilities to lead and bring people together.
Weekend 5-6	<b>Prayer for Resources for Ministry</b> - As churches in the UK gather to celebrate God in their lives and local communities, please remember the resources needed for God's mission in other parts of the world. As economies rise and fall, we pray for the generosity of God's people to remain consistent and to grow in generosity.
Mon <b>7</b>	<b>Focus on Romania / Ukraine. –</b> Continue to remember before our God the Ukraine war that has now lasted for 3 years, and 4 months. 200-250,000 Ukrainian casualties, up to 400,000 Russian and up to 30,000 civilian deaths. The sheer human misery and breakup of a nation, leaving countless families homeless, stateless and bereaved, is staggering. <i>Kyrie Eleison, Christ have mercy.</i>
Tue <b>8</b>	<b>Focus on Romania / Ukraine –</b> Particularly disturbing is the report that Russian forces have abducted 35,000 Ukrainian children and taken them across the border away from their families and communities. Pray for families separated to be brought together for the trauma to start to heal and for peace negotiations and diplomacy to bring the sides together.
Wed 9	<b>Focus on Romania/Ukraine -</b> Pray for our church planters in Romania, who have taken on significant new responsibilities to assist Ukrainian families, women, and children in rebuilding their lives there. Pray that these Ukrainians find stability in communities with the help of these church planters, and that the Romanian people continue to support them. Also, pray for resources, homes, and schools to be welcoming. Pray for rest and recuperation for the IN teams as well.
Thu 10	<b>Focus on IN Romania –</b> Please pray for Pastor Florin and his wife, Paula, as they manage changes in the Kindergarten and Joy Centre project, which UK donors have substantially supported since the war entered its second year. Pray for God to strengthen them, grant them peace amidst all the challenges, and that they feel supported by Christians in the UK who pray for them and help resource their work.
Fri <b>11</b>	<b>Focus on IN Romania –</b> Please pray for Mirel Talpes, head of IN Romania, and Pastor Doru Butas, as they together lead an incredible group of people reaching out to support local, Roma, and Ukrainian communities- bringing good news, growing disciples, and building the Church.
Weekend <b>12-13</b>	<b>Focus on INN -</b> As the International Needs Network grows in its capacity to work more cohesively, pray that God will bless all the different worldwide forums of knowledge sharing and mutual training to help build the whole organisation across 36 different countries. The programmes forum, the finance forum, the Executive Directors forums and the International Office, headed by Edmond Vanderpuye.

Mon <b>14</b>	<b>Praise and Thanksgiving Monday</b> - For all donors and supporters who actively and prayerfully back the work of IN across the globe. We give thanks to God for them, and for you, if you are reading this and praying today.
<sup>тие</sup> 15	<b>Pray for INA (Australia) -</b> Pray for Andrew Catford and the team in Melbourne, as they communicate the impact of IN's work globally to all the supporting churches and the donors of Australia, including the government. Pray for the team to develop close bonds and a great working spirit as they collaborate to be instruments of God's Kingdom work.
Wed <b>16</b>	<b>Prayer for IN New Zealand -</b> Please pray for Steve McCurdy our new ED of IN NZ as he seeks to build from Shaun and lead the team there. For their latest projects in Kenya and Sri Lanka to be blessed with success and for INNZ donors to grow in their cooperation and partnership with INNZ.
Thu 17	<b>Prayer for IN Kenya -</b> Particularly focus on prayer for Pastor Joshua as he works with the street boys, as he prays with them and encourages them to leave the streets. Pray for strength and resilience for the young men already engaged with Joshua, that they are not tempted back to the streets. Pray for the four young men who gave their lives to Christ at the beginning of this month, that they continue to grow in God and the Gospel.
Fri <b>18</b>	<b>Today is the International Day of Celebration, commemorating the life of Nelson Mandela.</b> His vision for South Africa and the continent of Africa drew people together. We remember that he stated, <i>"Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world."</i> Continue to ask God to remind people of that vision of hope and for the international community to continue to help grow children's education across the continent.
Weekend <b>19-20</b>	<b>Pray for our Leadership and Talent Centre near Nairobi in Kenya</b> as work progresses this year. Give thanks for the fencing of the 4.5-acre plot, which includes poles, chain links, and barbed wire. A gate has also been purchased and installed. The first buildings are underway, and goats are now being reared. The project has also installed water pipes to ensure a steady flow of water for the site's activities. A site house has been built to support ongoing operations and to provide accommodation for personnel. Part of the site house will also serve as a store for building materials.
Mon 21	<b>Praise and Thanksgiving Monday -</b> We thank God for the IN Kenya team, for the leadership of Jocelyn, the staff team, and all the various ministries they support, including our very own Pastor Joshua and Grace Empowerment. Especially pray for future development and wise succession planning. Thank God for the board and the growing responsibilities taken on by Kenyan Christians to support charitable work in their communities.
Tue 22	<b>Please pray for the staff team and the INUK board of trustees -</b> As the UK board seeks to refresh and recruit new trustees, pray for new individuals to be raised to join the board. Pray for continued cohesion in mission purpose and understanding, while the staff and trustees remain sensitive to the Spirit's direction.
Wed 23	<b>Prayer for UK staff –</b> Please pray for Danny, Ali, Kim, Zoe, Kirsty, Grace, Asmau and Ellie, who will be joining us in August to replace Carol and will be managing our finances. Pray for joy in their work and that everyone may be united by a shared vision to serve God together, supporting communities around the world.
Thur <b>24</b>	<b>Prayer for IN Uganda –</b> Ask for God's blessing on IN <b>Uganda's</b> plans to launch a third phase of its Disability Inclusion Programme, starting this month and running for three years. The project aims to enhance the capacities of 20 schools in Kayunga District and equip eight special schools with equipment suitable for children with severe disabilities. It is anticipated that 25 new schools will be integrated into the partnership, bringing the total to 53 schools that will serve approximately 2,900 children with disabilities.
Fri 25	<b>Prayer for IN Uganda –</b> As WASH 2 is reported on and a new WASH programme commences; we thank God for the impact of water projects on the lives of thousands in the Buikwe district. WASH has benefited 65,000 people with safe local water, new latrines that help prevent disease, and village water committees that continue to operate and enhance village water sources and hygiene standards. Continue to ask God to help communities work to keep wells and water sources maintained, defecation-free zones continued and loans schemes serving all the village.

Weekend <b>26-27</b>	<b>Please pray for the UK</b> – For churches in the UK to be bolder in proclaiming Christ in their communities, for the Quiet Revival reported by the Bible Society recently, and for growth in numbers and discipleship as we learn to put God first in every area of our lives.
Mon 28	<b>Praise and Thanksgiving Monday –</b> As we approach the end of July, we pause to reflect on God's faithfulness, generosity, and guidance for all that He is doing in His world, which He calls us to participate in.
Tue <b>29</b>	Pray for Haitian migrants in neighbouring <b>Dominican Republic</b> , where the government is scaling up deportations despite a marked increase in violence in Port-au-Prince (where many of the country's healthcare facilities are situated). Pregnant and postpartum Haitian women have reportedly avoided hospitals due to fears of deportation. Over 900 have been deported in one month under stricter government policies. Our Juan Calvino school in the Dominican Republic serves around 900 families of Haitian origin. Pray for them all during this time of uncertainty.
Wed 30	<b>World Day Against Trafficking –</b> Today, we ask God to help us as organisations working internationally to do what we can to help end the trade in people across borders, from poor nations, and where nations are at war. According to Anti-Slavery, Human trafficking is the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harbouring or receipt of people through force, fraud, coercion or deception, to exploit them for profit. In numbers: 50% of trafficking victims were trafficked into sexual exploitation, and 38% for forced labour. 67% of people trafficked for sexual exploitation are women. 67% of people investigated or arrested for trafficking in persons are men, and 33% women. 46% of trafficking victims are women, 34% are children, and 20% are men.
